





Themed Projects: Hen Harrier and Pearl Mussel






- Themes agreed with Commission as part of our RDP.
- OGs recruited by competitive tender
- Responsible then for developing local partnerships on the ground and developing actions

6 Target Areas 2,000 farmers



Scrub management, controlled burning, nest protection, honeypot measures.....

8 Target Areas 900 farmers



Reduce sedimentation, drain management, grazing/livestock management, buffer-zones....

'General' heading

Projects in this category will focus on **RD Priorities 2&3**, basically.....

- Farm viability and competitiveness
- Innovative farm technology and sustainable forest management
- Economic performance
- Food chain organisation, competiveness of producers, animal welfare and risk management




'Environmental' heading

Projects in this category will focus on **RD Priorities 4&5**, basically.....

- Restoring, preserving and enhancing ecosystems
- Resource efficiency, and a low carbon climate resilient sector
- Projects targeting restoration of upland peats specifically sought.





What's the process?

Call for Interest

- Competitive approach
 - NRN conference to publicise
 - Two calls -first call end 2016



- Very simple application to encourage participation
 - The Big Idea
 - Operational Group details
 - Estimated costs
- Selection Committee reviews and shortlists

Step 1



- Shortlisted projects produce detailed **project plan** (*What*, how, how much, when etc).
- Cost of plan **funded** under RDP ensures high-quality, single-standard plan.
- Workshop to help candidates.
- 4 months to produce.
- Selection Committee evaluate and **shortlist again**.

Step 2



- Shortlisted projects funded for full implementation
- Workshop to help, again (identify challenges, pitfalls, best practice, audit and accountability).
- Projects can run for up to **five years**.
- Outreach, PR, education, review and assessment will be critical components, plus **dissemination**.

Selection Committee



- Same committee for all phases and all proposals
- Membership
 - Policy experts from Department of Agriculture, Food & Marine
 - Environmental experts from National Parks and Wildlife Service
 - External representation to cover innovation, enterprise, third-levels and 'local' perspectives.

Eligible Costs



Eligible costs include

- Innovation broker to facilitate OG creation
- Cost related to researcher cooperating with OG
- Animation costs
- Running costs of cooperation
- Direct costs of implementing the OG plan




Step 1 Funding: drawing up Project Plans

- Learning to let go!




- Keeping it simple

- Hen Harrier Project Team in place but more work required before the right Pearl Mussel team emerges.
- Public Procurement process has brought its own difficulties
- First Open Call generated **118 ideas**. We have selected 22 to proceed to funded project-plan stage
