Introduction

The European Innovation Partnership 'Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability' (EIP-AGRI) aims to stimulate innovation and to contribute to the competitiveness and sustainability of European agriculture. See www.eip-agri.eu

As part of the drive towards sustainable growth and jobs, the European Commission will present its circular economy strategy in late 2015. The transition towards a circular economy will involve all stages of the value chain, from primary production through to final consumption.

This workshop will explore the implications for agriculture and forestry and identify concrete ways forward as part of this transition.

The overall purpose of this workshop is

- to bring relevant actors together and to discuss the role of agriculture and forestry in the circular economy;
- to identify challenges and opportunities in the transition towards a circular economy; and
- to define concrete actions to boost innovation in this transition.

A circular economy approach should look at the possible synergies between different food and feed production systems (how they can benefit from each other) as well as interfaces with other value and resource streams in the region (e.g. use of residual products or water from other non-farming activities). How can principles like 'minimising waste' and the 'reuse and recycling' be applied and what are the implications at farm level?

The workshop will focus on what concrete actions can be undertaken in the framework of rural development programmes (for example Operational Groups) and within the EIP-AGRI network.
