
The polish model of network support for EIP-AGRI Operational Groups

Operational Groups in Poland

The law:

- first call for Measure 16.1 the end of the first quarter of 2017,
- ordinance of the Minister of Agricultural and Rural Dewelopment on "Cooperation" – project.

Practice:

- 16 innovation brokers in regions
- First potential OG, some ideas: cultivation of non-genetically modified soybeans, bio-fertilizers, ecological protection of bees against parasites

Why we set this tool:

- The SIR's structure is based on public advisory system,
- advisors benefit from farmers' trust
- advisors have direct contact with farmers they are close to problems, needs and ideas,
- advisors act as "the bridge" between science and practice.

How we did this:

- first action: in 2015 we organised 16 workshops about Measure 16 for private and public advisors,
- choice of regional coordinators and innovation brokers,
- training SIR Staff meetings, instructions, telephone consultations,

How we did this:

- regular meetings of SIR Staff exchange of good practices, knowledge and ideas, improving soft skills,
- regional coordinators and innovation brokers train other advisors about The Network, Measure 16 and Operational Groups,
- advisors participate in events organised by SIR.

Effects:

- advisors support The Network they spread information about SIR, "Cooperation" and provide information from the rural areas about problems, needs, ideas and local leaders,
- they are prepare for participating in national Focus Groups and Operational Groups

Challenges to overcome:

- Advisors of 16 Voivodeship Agricultural Advisory Units (WODR)
 were not under the supervision of the main coordinator of SIR,
- WODRs dispose a small number of employed advisors, who have a lot of work with other Measures,

Successes:

- better cooperation between The Network Staff and local advisors - substantive support,
- greater involvement of local advisors in the transfer of knowledge,
- feedback about the effectiveness of actions taken



Examples of our tools: e-learning

Why we set this tool:

- cheap and fast method of sharing knowledge,
- the ability to control the progress of the participants,
- available and comfortable for users.

Participants: advisors, researchers, farmers, agri-food businessmen

Topics:

- Rural Development Program and innovations in RDP
- Measure 16 of RDP
- EIP-AGRI, SIR, examples of projects carried out by OG,
- The role of the partners in creation of operational groups.

Other activities in relations to OG

Examples

Done:

- stand "Knowledge and Innovation" at agricultural fairs
- workshops for potential OG stakeholders



Planned:

study tour for innovation brokers to the Czech Republic and Austria establish contacts with innovation support services and Operational Groups
