Why this subject?

- Irrigated lands represents 67% agricultural production in Spain
- Irrigated agriculture is highly energy-dependant
- Cost and GHG emissions increasing

Targets of the FG

Foster innovation aimed at:

- Reducing energy use and energy cost, both at infrastructure (common water services) and farm level.
- Replacing conventional energy with renewable energy produced in situ.
- Reducing GHG emissions and some other environmental impacts
- Controling invasive alien species which reduce energy efficience
- Use this FG as a pilot experience for upcoming FG









Starting paper

- Draft working paper elaborated by the Ministry of Agriculture
- Focusing the scope of the FG

Selection of FG's Members

- Call for expression of interest (<u>by means of National Rural Network</u> and IDI-a website)
- A small comitee (ministry, users and science institutions) evaluated the proposals
- 20 FG's members
 - 6 R&D universities/institutes
 - 2 Public assessment institutions
 - 2 Public and private companies (ICT provider and infrastructure builder)
 - 1 Farmers' associations
 - 7 Irrigation communities (associationes of farmers sharing the same infrastructure)
 - 1 Environmental NGO
 - 1 Climate change national office
- 1 Coordinator (member of the EIP-AGRI Team of the Ministry of Agriculture)

Working process

- 2 meeting at the Ministry of Agriculture (starting meeting, closing meeting)
- 6 months electronic working: Platform hosted by National Rural Network





Main differences with European FG (DG Agri, COM)

 Time for non FG member participation via NRN IDI-a website NEW (There is still a lot of useful knowledge/practice outside the FG)

FG's Ouputs

- <u>Database of professionals and organizations</u> interested in the FG subjects (for further networking aiming setting up operational groups)
- State of the Art in the FG topics
- <u>Database of the innovative knowledge and experiences gathered along</u> the FG lifecycle
- Identification of <u>priorities on Research</u>, <u>Development and Innovation on the FG topics</u>
- Appreciated priorities on information, <u>training and assessment</u> on the FG topics

Main learned lessons

- 1. Coordinator has a key role for the FG success.
- 2. The whole process takes a lot of effort and time (collect information, develop a common position,...)
- 3. Members tasks must be clearly established, according to their role and experience. Otherwise, their contributions will only be random ideas.
- 4. People who have not been selected as FG members may have a key role too, specially in the dissemination of the results.
- 5. Before launching a FG, it's absolutely necesary to establish a "pathway" and not work randomly, mainly related to FG topic selection process (what new national focus groups are going tobe launched in the near future?).
