Operational Groups – Some data

- Planned in period 2014-2020: about 3205 OGs
- Currently operational: about 200 OGs
- Constantly growing number of OGs: need for networking, exchange of experiences, capacity building, peer exchange









Operational Groups - Networking

- ✓ To know about each other (info about the project, databases, common template → EIP-AGRI database, website)
- ✓ To connect with each other (OGs working in the same thematic areas, linking to H2020 TNs, multi-actor projects)
- ✓ To learn from each other (exchange of experiences, good practices, peer exchange)




Operational Groups – Identified needs at the workshop

OG Networking and capacity building in 2017


New roles for farm advisors focusing on innovation (innovation brokers, innovation support services)



Various types of help (well connected to agric. world):

- Help to start up a specific group = prepare the project (innovation broker)
- Help to facilitate the project (facilitator, intermediate bridging between actors)
- Innovation support service (broad term, covering the former and more)

New roles for farm advisors (innovation support services)



Dissemination:

Connecting Operational Groups and generating "knowledge freely available to all" through practice abstracts in the EIP common format









Advisors - Role

- Central role in linking and matching innovation actors and processes
 - Providing information about funding opportunities
 - Matching farmer and its need to relevant researcher and research results
 - Translate research results to farmer language
 - Facilitate interaction
 - Disseminate project results









Advisors – Needs

- Needs to fulfil this central role:
 - Improve existing toolkit (org events, showcasing inspiring case studies, tailoring websites/databases, develop factsheets in native languages, tools for connecting partners)
 - Support, capacity building and training (directing resources for facilitation and training, receiving training and capacity in information sharing systems, support needed from national/regional farmer organisations, researchers)
 - ➤ More exchanges are needed how ISS work accross the EU
 - ➤ Relevant learning experiences visiting established OGs and innovation networks
