### **6 Union priorities for rural development**

1. Knowledge transfer / innovation in agriculture, forestry, rural areas

2. Viability of all types of farming in all regions; innovative farm technologies; Sustainable management of forests

3. Food chain organisation, animal welfare, risk management in agriculture

4. Ecosystems related to agriculture and forestry

5. Resource efficiency, low-carbon / climate-resilient economy in agriculture, food and forestry sectors

6. Social inclusion, poverty reduction and economic development in rural areas



### **Detailed example: priority 5 + focus areas**

- 5. Promoting **resource-efficiency** and supporting the shift towards a **low-carbon** and **climate-resilient** economy in the agriculture, food and forestry sectors, with a focus on the following areas:
  - increasing **efficiency in water use** by agriculture
  - increasing efficiency in energy use in agriculture and food processing
  - facilitating the supply and use of renewable sources of energy, of by-products, wastes, residues and other non-food raw material for purposes of the bio-economy
  - reducing greenhouse gas and ammonia emissions from agriculture
  - fostering carbon conservation and sequestration in agriculture and forestry

# "A little less conversation, a little more action"


If desired, possible to fund **only setting-up** of cluster, network etc. (i.e. not fund project itself)... provided that:

Cluster / network / operational group etc. **demonstrably has an active project** which will contribute to RD priorities

I.e. No funding for pure "lunch clubs" or "talk shops"



## **Don't break any laws**

- State aid rules apply when output of project falls outside Annex I to the Treaty
- State aid rules are sometimes more restrictive
- Key sets of rules / guidelines to watch:
  - Guidelines on state aid in the agriculture and forestry sector and in rural areas
  - General Block Exemption Regulation
  - Guidelines on state aid for research, development & innovation
