#### Inge Van Oost

#### **European Commission, DG Agriculture and Rural Development**

Inge Van Oost is policy officer at the European Commission, Directorate General Agriculture and Rural Development (DG AGRI). She has been setting up and is now supporting the implementation of the European Innovation Partnership "Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability" (EIP-AGRI), in particular as regards rural development and cross-cutting aspects in Horizon 2020. As member of the DG AGRI Taskforce "Research and Innovation" she was instrumental in shaping DG AGRI's research and innovation approach and Horizon 2020 work programmes, and developed the new concepts "multi-actor approach" and "thematic networks". In her former post at the Commission she was policy officer in the Direct Support Unit and the Cross Compliance Unit, responsible for cross-compliance, the Farm Advisory System and interlinking with the Rural Development policy.

Before working at the Commission Inge Van Oost was coordinator of the demonstration projects at the Directorate-General for Agriculture and Horticulture of the Flemish Region. There she drafted rural development measures and designed the farm advisory system. She was also evaluator of many agricultural research projects and member of diverse selection committees. In the former federal Belgian Administration for Agriculture she served the Secretariat-General as coordinator of the Horticultural Chain, dealing with chain management, food quality, traceability and safety, sustainability of production methods, communication with consumers and much more.

Before joining the administration, she worked as a farm advisor, and after a while as coordinator of the advisory team. Based in an applied research institute, the team did not only advise farmers, but also designed and implemented experiments and on-farm demonstration projects.



#### **Leanne Townsend**

#### **James Hutton Institute, UK**



#### **James Gaffey**

#### **Institute of Technology, Tralee, Ireland**

James is Principal Investigator in Bioeconomy at Shannon Applied Biotechnology Centre at Institute of Technology Tralee, and Academic Collaborator in the SFI BEACON Bioeconomy Research Centre. James is coordinator of Biorefinery Glas (2019-2021) co-funded by the EU and Ireland's Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine. Biorefinery Glas is an EIP-Agri initiative and represents Ireland's first small-scale biorefinery demonstration project, supporting new business models and farmer diversification into the bioeconomy. James is also Scientific Coordinator & PI on the H2020 Biobased Industries (BBI JU) initiative ICT-BIOCHAIN (2018-2020) developing efficient supply chains for Ireland's National Bioeconomy Campus at Lisheen. ICT-BIOCHAIN represents the EU's first Digital Innovation Hub for Circular Bioeconomy. James is also a member of the BBI JU INGREEN project team (2019-2023). James was biorefinery specialist on the EU Horizon 2020 AgriForValor Project (2016-2018). James previously worked at NUI Galway (Technology Centre for Biorefining and Bioenergy) as part of the "Bio-Éire - a Bioeconomy for Ireland" team, including UCD, Teagasc and DIT. The results of Bio-Éire form a key part of the knowledge base currently being used by the Department of the Taoiseach (Prime Minister's Office) to develop a National Bioeconomy Policy Statement for Ireland. James has worked in the field of advanced biorefining since 2009 through work with Cellulac Ltd., Competence Centre for Biorefining and Bioenergy (NUI Galway), Sustainable Biopolymers Ltd., tcbb RESOURCE and Tralee Institute of Technology.

#### **Bavo Verwimp**

#### The Kijfelaar, Belgium

Bavo studied agricultural engineering at the KU Leuven, Belgium, option animal husbandry. Later on, he completed a 'special degree' in agricultural economics at the UC Louvain La Neuve, Belgium. With this degrees he has been working as a teacher, counseler (Vlaams Agrarisch Centrum) and as an officer for the Flemish government (Vlaamse Landmaatschappij).

In 2008 he took over the farm from his parents in the Kempen, north eastern part of Flanders, a region with sandy soils. They changed the specialised dairy farm into a mixed organic farm (cattle, horticulture). They aren't any more specialised in a specific crop or product, but we're specialised in direct selling. In this way they succeeded in making their small farm profitable, but they created also a nice place to work and to live (www.dekijfelaar.be)

## National Federation of CUMA (Farm Machinery cooperatives) – Farmer, France

Stéphane Diard set up in 1998 as dairy farmer in the Western part of France, close to Angers. He also chose to develop direct selling on his farm and educational activities.

His Cuma gather 40 local farmers, who use 50 different agricultural equipment, from air seeder to striptill. Deeply involved in the cooperative life of this group, M. Diard is especially in charge of the silage activity.

Since 2008, he is administrator of the local federation of Cuma, and become in 2015 member of the Board of the regional federation (Union des Cuma des Pays de Loire). In 2016, he also joined the Board of the National Federation of Cuma.
