

## 1. Annual Work Programme (AWP) 2012: priorities supporting RDP implementation

## 2. Thematic Initiatives launched by the Network

- **New thematic issues that the network is planning to address:**
  - Foresight (future of rural areas) and economic development of rural areas.
  - Issues addressed by the events:

    - November 2012 – Regional Workshop : Young and Farmer
    - December 2012 – Regional seminar : New mobilities
  - Issues addressed by working groups:
  - All the 12 topics treated by the Network are addressed by working groups.

  - Self-assessment
- **Issues subject of surveys/consultation/analysis:**
  - Consultation of RDP beneficiaries active in tourism: needs, items to be approached within working group;
  - Analysis of our members' networking activities (systemic approach).
- **Thematic issues addressed in other ways:**
  - Mobility, Multifunctional agriculture, Young farmers, Tourism is addressed through field visits.
