


MUSIC, RECORDING & MULTIMEDIA STUDIO

Short term objectives – fully renovate the building (general constructions works, sewage and water system, electricity, heating etc.) and provide equipment for the studio.


Long term goal - to create an active, self-sustainable music and multimedia studio that would serve as a non-commercial platform for youth to spend free time in a creative way, obtain knowledge and skills in the field of creative industries.

LONG TERM VISION

Micro-communities

NGO based youth centres that provide infrastructure & know-how (music and art studios, practical workshops etc.) for the local communities.

- Free time + non-formal lifelong learning


- Practical know-how




Fully renovated and equipped building for studio needs (Estimated attendance – 70 persons a week)




- Rehearsal/recording space














- Monitoring/mixing room

LESSONS LEARNT / TRANSFERABILITY

- Independent youth studios are viable alternative to institutionalized cultural infrastructure thanks to flexibility, creativitity, and responsibility.
 - Support for non-agricultural economic activities in rural areas (creative industry artists, translators, designers, country music studios etc.)
 - Bridging the gap between the free time of a teenager and studies, professional career

Potential problems: lack of human resources, regular financing, autonomy as a possible deviation
