

Introduction

Leader ('Liaison Entre Actions de Développement de l'Économie Rurale', meaning 'Links between the rural conomy and development actions'), is an approach used by Local Action Groups (LAGs) to implement and nance their local development strategies. These strategies are designed to promote public-private sector partnerships, using a multi-sectoral, bottom-up approach that encourages local cooperation and networking.

The Leader approach forms one of the four axes of Rural Development Policy 2007-2013. It takes account of the three thematic axes which form the core objectives of the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD). Leader is a required element of the RDPs for the 2007-2013 programming period. The total budget for the Leader axis is EUR 13.788 billion, of which the EAFRD contribution is EUR 5.4 billion, with the remainder made up of public and private contributions. A variety of guidance materials have been produced in the past about rural development and transnational cooperation (TNC). Many of these have been prepared by National Rural Networks and provide a mix of useful methodological or technical advice on TNC approaches. These materials have now been distilled and re-packaged in the following 'Integrated European Cooperation Guide', which aims to provide an effective cooperation tool tailored to the needs of the current 2007-2013 programming period.

The Integrated European Cooperation Guide covers a range of relevant TNC information focusing on two core aims:

- · to clarify what cooperation is and the benefits it can bring; and
- . to present a comprehensive step by step series of methodological guidance, that clearly explains concepts linked to planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of cooperation projects

A dedicated axis 4 funding measure is available from Member States' Rural Development Programmes (RDPs) to support cooperation actions, and each Member State has established its own rules regarding implementation of this measure (number 421). Such RDP guidance should always be consulted first of all, before undertaking any detailed preparation work on cooperation projects, since understanding the RDP rules and procedures is one of the keys to successful project performance.

Future updates of the Integrated European Cooperation Guide will incorporate links to the Member States' own administrative rules (Administrative rules and procedures). Updates will also aim to reflect the information needs of readers and so please send any suggestions for new and useful material, or general feedback on the guide, to cooperation@enrd.eu. Your comments are warmly welcomed!




