### Each principle of the **LEADER method** for <u>each</u> LAG


- focused on subregional areas;
- led by local action groups composed of representatives of public and private local socioeconomic interests, in which no single interest group controls the decision-making; inclusive (Art. 33. 2)
- carried out through strategies;
- supportive of networking, accessibility, innovative features in the local context and, where appropriate, cooperation with other territorial actors

(art 31 of Regulation 1060/2021)





# Added value of LEADER approach

## Some (other) practical considerations in the CAP Plans

 Scope of operations under Local Development Strategies: sufficiently open to allow for bottom up approach, yet ensuring the added value;

 Placed in the strategic context of each CAP Plan, linked to the needs, intervention logic, complementary CAP interventions and non-CAP measures – mostly relevant to CAP Specific objective 8.





## Exclusive functions of LAGs

- building the capacity of local actors to develop and implement operations;
- drawing up a non-discriminatory and transparent **selection procedure and criteria**, which avoids conflicts of interest and ensures that no single interest group controls selection decisions;
- preparing and publishing calls for proposals;
- **selecting operations** and fixing the amount of support and presenting the proposals to the body responsible for final verification of eligibility before approval;
- monitoring progress towards the achievement of objectives of the strategy;
- evaluating the implementation of the strategy

Mindful: if more functions, there needs to a formal delegation to LAG as intermediate body (and appropriate resources) – they should not be performed at the expense of core functions (especially animation)

Reg 1060/2021, Art 33, point 3)





#### Performance indicators

Output indicator: number of Local Development Strategies prepared or implemented

Result indicator: share of rural population covered by Local Development Strategy

Other result indicators: choose a few most relevant once and add after the selection of Local Development Strategies (bottom up)

Average cost of output – maximum average cost of output
