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Evaluation of current situation

- ENRD LAG Survey 2017:
 - essential or important: bottom up 95%; Innovative approaches 78%
 - Able to implement fully or mostly: bottom up 86%; Innovative approaches 78%
 - Discrepancy between real time spent and the wish for time supporting innovation at LAG level
- LEADER case study: Social innovation implicit to LEADER approach
 - Is one of the most appropriate and successful approaches in bringing about social innovation

Spreading Innovation

- Cooperation LEADER and ESF:
 - thematic calls for LAGs
 - LEADER brings regional topics, networks and social innovation
 - ESF brings their networks, experience and of course funds.
 - win-win situation for FSF and LFADER
- Changes in LEADER and interventions in CSP using some principles:
 - Local Agenda 21 processes implemented with LEADER participation (bottom up)
 - Rural Innovation systems: multi actor approach, similar EIP but outside of AGRI sector
 - Reactivation of village centers: participation in Village/City development concepts

Regional development – capacity building

- Design of a course for LAG- and other regional Managements:
 - extra-occupational
 - related to practice
 - Improvement of skills according to needs of regions
 - Holistic understanding of regional management: to bring people together
 - Foster innovation, bottom up approach and cooperation

Participative development of contents

- Steering group:
 - Ministry of Agriculture, Regions and Tourism (MA EAFRD; coordination of ERDF), Regions,
 LAG, NRN, Environment Agency Austria, University College for Agrarian and Environmental
 Pedagogy, AT Climate & Energy fund
 - Cooperation/coordination with University of Vienna
- Needs: Workshops and Interviews with target group (regional managers):
 - First outcomes: technical and professional expertise (project management..) and how to interact with people
- Time line: Draft curriculum end of 2022, Call in the CSP intervention middle of 2023, start in autumn 2023

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
