


CHALLENGES OF OUR RURAL AREAS


- Access to public and private services 40% lack access to high speed internet
- ► 59% of rural population in regions demographically shrinking
- ► A number of rural areas facing the twin-challenge of low income and rapidly declining population




Next Generation Access (NGA) broadband coverage in the EU (%households)











MANY OPPORTUNITIES AHEAD

- Circular and bio-based economy
- Ecological and digital transition
- Recovery from COVID 19 crisis and changes to society which rural areas could benefit from (i.e. increased teleworking, appreciation for green spaces...)

Why now?

- Signaling that the Commission takes rural areas seriously
- Addressing pressing issues for rural areas from demographic change to connectivity, the risk of poverty and limited access to services.
- Highlighting new challenges and opportunities (including links to COVID 19 recovery)





How?

- ► AGRI and REGIO Commissioners work together under the coordination of VP Suica.
- Public Consultation with people living in rural areas, local and regional authorities.
- Ensuring specific needs of rural areas are duly taken into account both under the Cohesion policy programmes and under the CAP Strategic Plans for the period 2021-2027

- ► Roadmap (feedback open from 22/7 to 9/9)
- ▶ Online questionnaire published on 07/09 til 30/11
- **Eurobarometer** (27,237 interviews in all Member States)
- ▶ 3 events at European Week of Regions and Cities, one with 3 Commissioners (13/10/2020)
- ► Foresight Thematic group ongoing
- ► Final conference organised by the ENRD (March 2021)
- Own initiative opinion prepared by EESC and ongoing by CoR on rural issues

Digital exclusion - Workshops to combat digital exclusion in rural areas

EAFRD-funded projects

A LAG organised a series of tailored workshops to combat digital exclusion among people over 50 years old.

Summary

A local action group organised a series of three-day workshops in nine municipalities for residents over 50 years old with limited computer skills. The workshops were conducted by a professional trainer. After passing a competency test and committing to 100% attendance at the workshops the participants received tablets and keyboards to continue practising their skills.



These workshops were organised in response to the identified need to develop computer skills among inhabitants aged over 50 in the LAG area. The project promoter is the LAG Northern Jura Partnership Association.



Examples of projects financed by EAFRD

Work training and placements in rural Italy
The 'Terre e Comuni' (Land and
Municipalities) project provided training and
work placements to young unemployed
immigrants and local people in Frosinone,
central Italy. It has resulted in a new
association working in close cooperation with
the local asylum centre to provide new

opportunities to young immigrants.





Young Italians and immigrants followed a course of agricultural training together.



Examples of projects financed by EAFRD

Cost-effective mobile healthcare services in rural Finland - The "Mallu does the rounds" project provided an easy-to-access medical service to people in rural areas of Finland using the Mallu bus. The bus met important needs amongst rural populations as well as providing the social and health care authorities with vital information about rural healthcare needs.
