

LAG IMPLEMENTATION SURVEY 2017

- Implementation 'on the ground' LAGs viewpoint
- Wide-reaching (710 responses from 27 MS)
- Possible improvements for current and future periods
- 22% 'new LAGs'
- 44% 'Existing for 3 or more periods'







LAG IMPLEMENTATION SURVEY 2017 Some first hints...

- 48% of LAGs would welcome increase in independence and responsibility
- No1 Operational priority is to achieve the LDS objectives but only 13% consider they have the commensurate freedom to do so
- 'Cooperation' and 'Innovation' are most difficult to implement
- Highest request to ENRD 'support for technical elements'






P4 – Smart Villages (Thematic Group)

The TG is exploring how rural services in areas such as health, social services, education, energy, transport, retail and others, can be improved and made more sustainable through

- a) by supporting social innovation and community-led actions, and/or
- b) By the deployment of ICT tools





To share examples of emerging strategies and projects for the revitalization of rural services (social and digital innovation).

To make recommendations about how the RDPs can be used to support these strategies in coordination with other policies (especially M7-Basic Services and M19-LEADER).

To provide links to project examples and databases, research, tools, networks and organisations which can help rural communities improve rural services (Smart Villages Portal).

P5 – Sustainable management of water and soils (Thematic Group and linked workshops)

The TG is exploring opportunities for a more efficient use of Rural Development Programmes (RDPs) to support the sustainable management of water and soils.

The aim is to formulate concrete recommendations on how the design and implementation of measures programmed under the RDPs can be improved to better address soil protection and water management.


P6 - Making rural communities attractive and inclusive

Hierarchy of needs:

Different rural areas have very different social and demographic needs

Social proofing:

How to make sure that RDPs & other policies contribute to social inclusion?





OBJECTIVES:

- To support stakeholders in addressing demographic and social inclusion issues in rural areas through the identification of inspiring approaches and practices;
- To identify ways in which RDPs could most effectively respond to demographic change and promote social inclusion in rural areas.

ACTIVITIES:

- Background research: thematic briefs, case studies
- Stakeholder discussions through the online platform of VIIMA
- Meeting with NRNs and other stakeholders (Nov 2017, Cyprus) to discuss key challenges & plan actions
- Next meeting RD Policy Workshop envisaged for April/May – topic under consideration (TBC)


