Shared responsibility Commission/Member States




Objectives of the Performance Framework

- ✓ Monitor progress towards achieving objectives
 - ✓ annual reporting of distance from *milestones and* targets for result indicators
- ✓ <u>Assess impact</u>, effectiveness, efficiency, relevance, coherence and Union added value of the CAP
- ✓ Support <u>common learning process</u> towards monitoring and evaluation.





THE NEW DELIVERY MODEL OF THE CAP





FOCUS ON PERFORMANCE

- ✓ In the CAP Strategic Plans Member States will set targets on what they want to achieve per objective in the programming period using common result indicators.
- ✓ Annual policy performance review will rely on those result indicators. Member States will report in Annual Performance Reports on the implementation of the CAP Strategic Plan on realised output and expenditure, as well as on distance to milestones and targets for result indicators.
- ✓ Overall policy performance will be assessed multiannually on the basis of <u>impact indicators</u>.

PMEF - types of indicators

Common Context Indicators

 reflect general trends in the economy, environment and society (SWOT).

Common <u>Output</u> Indicators - relate to the immediate output generated by an intervention supported (e.g. number of projects funded).

Common Result
Indicators


 link interventions to specific policy objectives; measure the direct effects of a policy and are used to set quantified milestones and targets in the CAP Strategic Plans.

Common Impact Indicators

 refer to longer term, direct and indirect policy effects and overall performance



How the indicators fit together



Performance Framework - key elements

Scope:

✓ CAP Strategic Plans and market measures outside CAP Plan

Elements:

- ✓ The set of common indicators
- ✓ Quantified targets and annual milestones in the CAP Plans (<u>result indicators</u>)
- ✓ Data management and regular reporting activities on performance
- ✓ Incentive mechanisms to reward good performance and mechanisms addressing low under-performance (established in the Basic Act)
- ✓ Ex-ante, interim, ex-post and other evaluation activities
