Background

Why setting up a CLLD Thematic Cluster?

- CLLD is a core element of **future CSF Funds** programming (Proposed Common Provisions Regulations; recently published Common Guidelines of four DGs on CLLD)
- CLLD & multi-funding are among the most relevant themes of **common interest** for rural development stakeholders (e.g. information on CLLD and multi-funding was identified as one of the main expectations by 2013 Leader event participants)
- **Publicly available information**/specific details were relatively **limited** to date (i.e. lots of uncertainties about the way forward at national level)
- Need for **exchange of information and experience** among relevant stakeholders (timing is important, i.e preparation for next programme)



The CLLD in Hungary

- HNRN will take the leading role within the CLLD thematic cluster
- The HNRN is actively participating in the planning of the rural development programme co-funded by the EU for 2014-2020
- The Presidency delegated experts to every work group tasked by the Ministry of Rural Development with planning
- The HNRN is also responsible for the social consultation of the Rural Development Programme 2014-2020

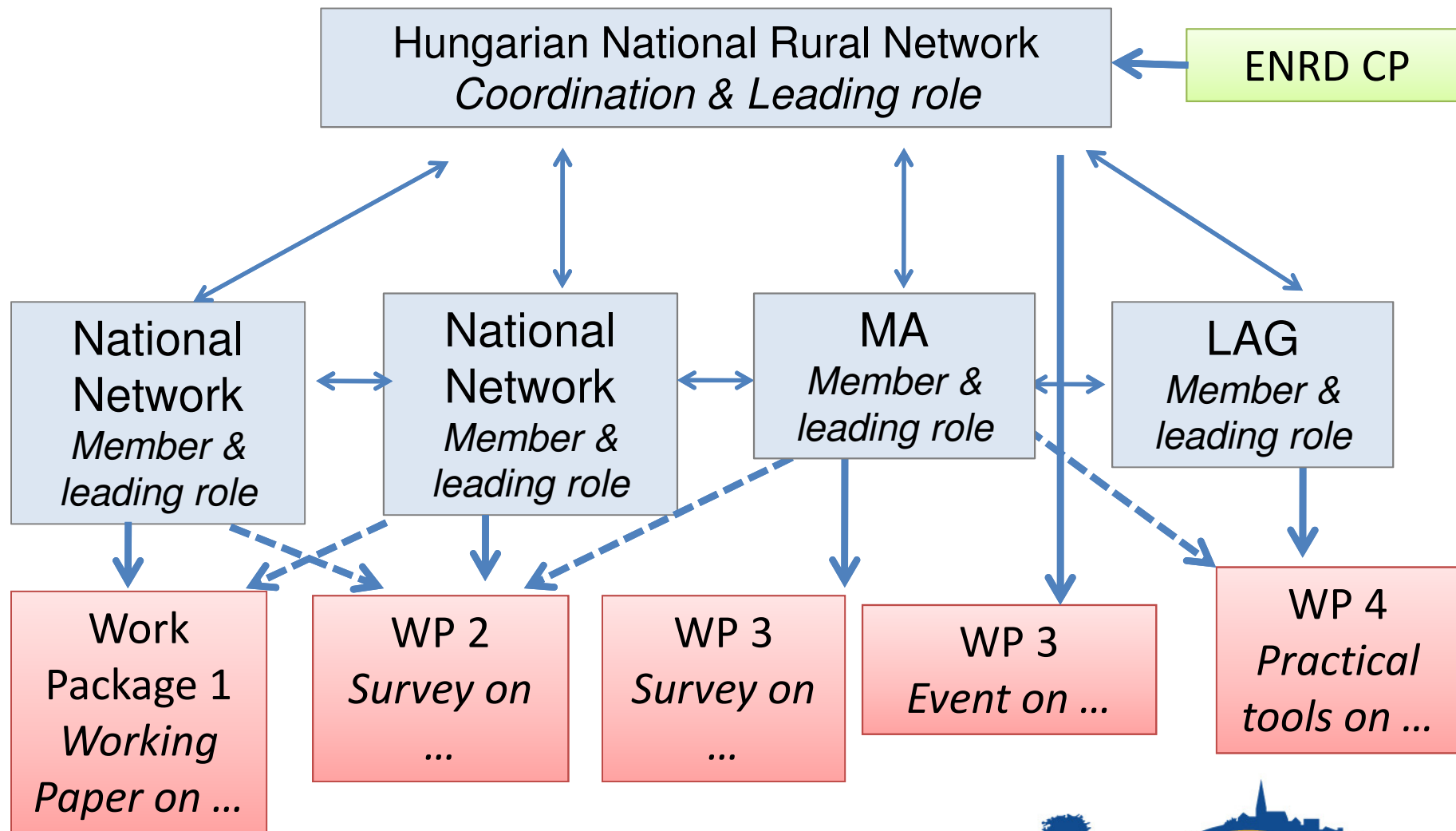


Objective of CLLD cluster

- Enhance cooperation & exchange of experience
- Concentrate and economise efforts of individual networks / avoid duplication of work
- Produce practically-focused tools and guidance
- Articulate needs and information gaps towards national and EU-level policy makers
- Feed into seminars, workshops, conferences (e.g. organised by DG AGRI)

Methodology

- Setting-up of cluster: working paper; CLLD mapping survey; initial contact with NRNs – collection of ideas; kick-off meeting
- Joint development of cluster work programme (work packages) on the basis of members' interest
- Each member takes leading role with regard to one of the work packages; others contribute
