




Your agenda!

In the agenda of you will see an activity called 'Open discussions'. This agenda item needs some explanation. To have inspirational discussions that create bridges amongst stakeholders towards the realization of concrete actions, for the next programming period for making LEADER more effective we need to have a bit of a plan.

Having an inspirational discussion with 450 people is possible - but for a limited time. Therefore we aim to have a **plenary 'open discussion'** combined with smaller extended **open discussions** on 3 main **themes** take place.



Three themes in three streams

Theme for Stream 1 – How can we **design** a Rural Development Programme which captures the added value of LEADER?

Theme for Stream 2 - How can we **develop** more effective Local Development Strategies and Local Action Groups?

Theme for Stream 3 – How can we **deliver** the LEADER approach more simply and efficiently?

Why these **streams**? They are based on extended preparatory work, suggestions and ideas of which many of **you provided through MyENRD platform**.

You have extensive experience with LEADER from different perspectives – as representatives of Managing Authorities, Local action groups, Paying agencies or other organizations.

There are many practices that you want to share, you recently experienced challenges, you have questions you wish to share and discuss that would make your work with LEADER reach the effect you need. ... Or maybe something that is bothering you, a super idea that you have, something not clear that you would like to have your peers assist you with... something specific...something burning... What to do then? Put your topic as an agenda item under one of the overarching THEMES you choose to join! How?



LEADER: Building bridges for the future "Open Discussions" during Day 2 of the event



On April 17, day 1 of the event, between 16.30 hrs. to 17.30 hrs., during the introduction of the 'Open Discussions' session, you have the opportunity to raise the topic that **you** would like to discuss. Just anything you like? Yes, **as long as** it contributes to answering one of the overall stream questions as they have been outlined above and **as long as you are willing to initiate and help** an open discussion with a group of people that will join you.

An empty square is waiting to be filled with **your** suggestion!

If you are one of those suggesting a topic, then also realize that you need to be ready to 'host' the topic, which means as much as *facilitating* the topic open discussion: ensuring that all participants feel at ease to share views, opinions, ideas, etc. Each topic also needs to have a 'harvester': somebody ensuring that the fruits of the discussions are not lost but cherished by noting AND visualizing these ideas, views, the shared practices, the common conclusions made, statements raised, etc., on your group **flipchart paper and board**.

On 18 April, the second day of the event, the moderators welcome you at 08.45, thus warming you up for the day where we will bridge experiences and ideas through **open discussions** for which you have set the agenda. Where to find your streams? In the Auditorium, Studio or Riverside (see your map in the Agenda):
