

What is it

The Colmcille Challenge is a rowing challenge from Port Ellen on the Isle of Islay to Lough Foyle on the east coast of Inishowen.

Distance; Port Ellen to Greencastle, 42 miles

It is envisaged that it will become a biennial event.

When will it happen

The first Colmcille Challenge will take place on 9th July 2011.

The date is subject to weather conditions, and may vary a day on either side

Who can take part

The inaugural event will consist of 4 boats and crews, 2 from Foyle Rowing Club in Moville, and 2 from Islay Rowing Club.

Other clubs may be accommodated but at their own risk

- X Pembrokeshire Longboats
- x Irish Coastal Rowing boats
- X Traditional sea rowing boats

Each boat should have a crew of 10.

Mixed crews should comprise 5 men and 5 women
