### **European Solidarity Corps**





- European Solidarity Corps make young people (18-30) to be engaged by participating organisations for solidarity volunteering activities or solidarity jobs for 2-12 months
- EU supports the costs of the solidarity volunteers
- **Fields of intervention** include activities of general interest (i.e. education, health, integration of migrants & refugees, provision of food, environmental protection, prevention of natural disasters such as floods or forest fires...)
- Several activities are related to rural areas and agriculture.

## Implementation: Pilot Phase (2016-17)





- Already 20 000 young people registered
- At present CAP contributes with EAFRD (TA) managed via LIFE programme of DG Environment.
- SC volunteers under <u>LIFE call</u> can be engaged for environmental protection, mainly Natura 2000 sites and species protected by the Birds and Habitats Directives - Deadline 7 MARCH 2017
