Why LEADER/CLLD evaluation?

LEADER:

- Bottom up, multi-sector, partnership and area based tool
- From rural development laboratory to widely used rural policy instrument

CLLD:

 Enlarged in scope of actions, size of budget and eligible beneficiaries/territories



Why LEADER/CLLD evaluation?

LEADER/CLLD should be evaluated as any other intervention supported by EU policy in order to:

- Increase the accountability and transparency of interventions,
- Demonstrate achievements towards EU national and local objectives,
- Assess effectiveness, efficiency, results and impacts, and
- Learn how to design and implement LEADER/CLLD better



What are the legal requirements in relation to evaluation?

Managing authorities

Evaluation plan:

- topics and activities linked to the contribution of CLLD strategy and
- support for evaluation at LAG level

Assessment of results and impacts, and answering the evaluation questions:

- Contributions of LEADER/CLLD to EU rural development policy objectives
- Contribution to EU2020 strategy

(808/2014)

Local action groups

M&E activities in the CLLD strategy (including costs) and their implementation

Development of CLLD strategy' specific evaluation questions and indicators

Provision of information for RDP evaluation

(1303/2013 and 1305/2013, Art.71)



Common monitoring and evaluation system and LEADER/CLLD

Intervention logic – LEADER/CLLD programmed under focus area 6B but contributing also to other focus areas

One common evaluation question (adapted to Leader): "To what extent has LEADER/CLLD contributed to local development?"

Common indicators in operations database (at RDP level) for:

- Leader approach
- For projects implemented under CLLD strategy
- For monitoring the Leader contribution to main focus areas



TWG objectives

TWG aims to complete the CMES and existing guidelines and provide sufficient information and guidance to carry out effective evaluation of LEADER/CLLD

Specific objectives are to:

- Examine and address the major challenges in the evaluation of LEADER/CLLD,
- Build up and capitalise on existing experiences in evaluation of LEADER/CLLD,
- Identify and design effective solutions and approaches in the evaluation of LEADER/CLLD at national/regional and local levels;
