**For the future: Focusing on LEADER achievement?

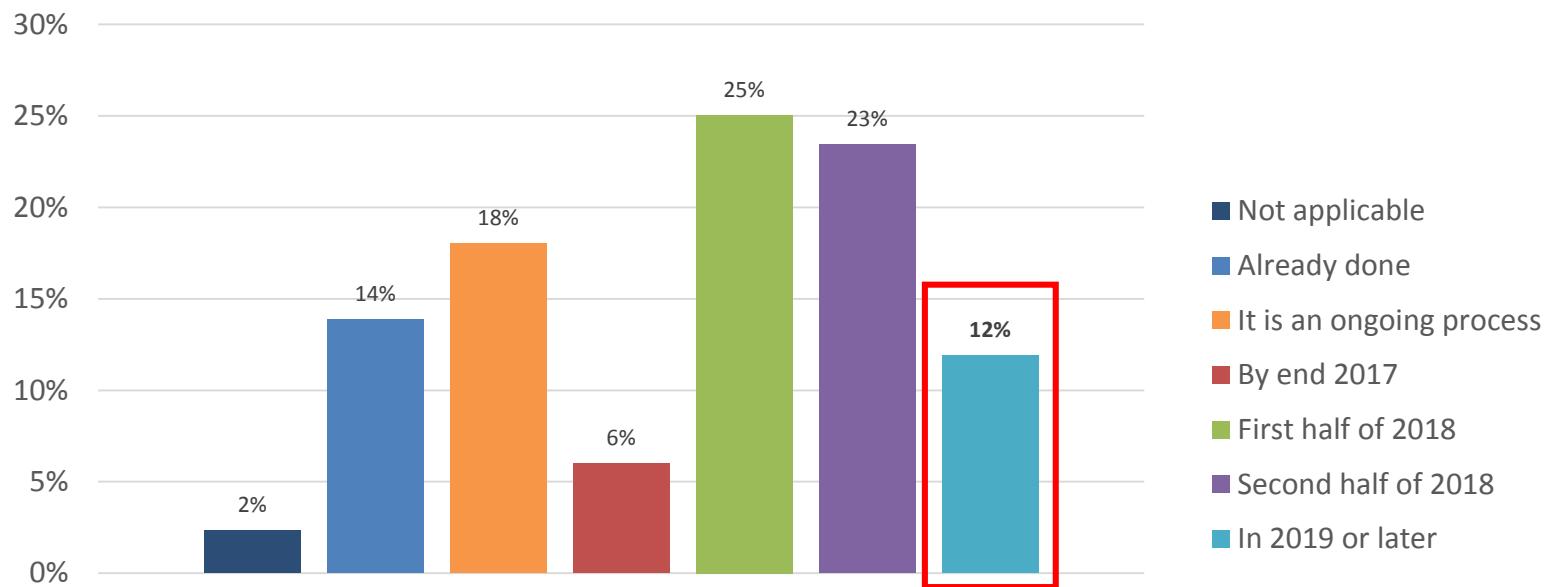
