








State of play – transnational cooperation

Based on data as of December 2019










Lesson learnt – LAG Survey



- 38 questions / 710 respondent LAGs from 23 EU Member States
- 'bottom-up approach' the highest 'valued' LEADER principle
- Challenging to implement cooperation projects and innovation
- Bureaucracy and administrative requirements perceived as constraining factors
- National / regional delivery frameworks can limit LAGs' freedom to pursue operational priorities (including 'project development', animation, innovation)
- To improve:
 - Application processes (simplify and reduce time taken to select / approve projects)
 - Systems of controls (make more proportionate)
 - Understanding of controls requirements
 - Coordination and cooperation in the delivery chain
 - Quality management





Lesson learnt - cooperation



- Common understanding of joint actions and common costs
- TNC integrated into the Local Development Strategy
- TNC projects selected by Local Action Groups
- Information sharing between Member States
- Generic and common templates
- Allow local partners to get involved in cooperation
- Coordinated submission of project proposals by partners
- Coordinated approval by MS authorities
- Reduce information gaps and diversity of MS TNC rules








Lesson learnt – innovation





- Improve common understanding of innovation in LEADER
- From 'top-down and controls' to 'bottom up and partnership'
- Improve clarity of regulations and rules
- Use control and audit findings in capacity building for LAGs and RDP authorities
- Set up joint quality management systems
- Ensure sufficient resources and capacities
 for LEADER innovation at the local level
- Create positive 'feedback loops' in controls based on understanding errors and improving systems







Lesson learnt – simplification



- Reduce 'gold-plating'
- Enhance the application of simplified cost options (SCOs)
- Strengthen communication and common understanding of SCOs between LAGs, MAs, PAs, and audit
- Distinguish clearly between mistakes and fraud
- Increase the scope of LAG animation
- Controls should be reasonable and proportionate
- Problem-solving attitude at all levels
- Consider setting up national CLLD support units/working groups







Lesson learnt – thematic labs



LEADER and Smart Villages

- LAGs as 'innovation brokers'
- Strong mandate for LAGs to engage in a social innovation process
- Appropriate financial support
- A simple financial framework
- Use of SCOs
- Collective projects by LAGs and social innovation
- LAGs enabled to draw in external expertise

LEADER and Climate Action

- Awareness-raising and engaging with local communities and decisionmakers
- Key role of LEADER 'animators' recognised in CAP Plans
- 'Ring-fencing' specific budget for climate action within the LDS
- Flexible CAP framework LAGs working across all objectives
- LAG-led projects and LAG projects to support animation
- LAGs enabled to draw in external expertise







Recurring themes - LEADER implementation



- Involve LAGs in designing an enabling delivery system
- Strengthened NRN role in coaching, peer to peer, support to LEADER networking
- Clear designation of responsibilities in the delivery chain and common understanding of roles
- Enable LAGs to operate as 'one stop' local development platforms
- Simplification, proportional controls, reduction of administrative burden
- Focus on local objectives and development impact
- Evidence of impact and the use of additional indicators
- Strategic animation
- LAG freedom to design and adapt the LDS and 'own' projects
