Decision on the organisational structure and Operation for the European Network for Rural Development (ENRD) and the European Innovation Partnership (EIP)

- This Decision proposes a <u>joint organisational</u> <u>structure</u> for both networks
- The objective of this common structure is triple fold:
 - It ensures coordination and achieves synergies between the activities of the ENRD and the EIP network
 - It delivers efficiency gains compared to the coexistence of two separate governance bodies
 - The flexible set-up for thematic work

The suggested approach was tested over several months in numerous discussions with stakeholders


