Erik Mathijs

May 11, 11.45-12.30

Food Cabinet

May 11, 15.20-16.00

Food Cabinet supports organizations who want to contribute to a better food system by promoting new forms of cooperation, communication and organization. Helen Kranstauber, creative brain of Food Cabinet, will illustrate the connection between urban and rural by presenting some projects. Sietske Klooster is a designer and explores milk as a cultural product. With “milk tasting sessions” she brings farmers and citizens together to discover the values of milk.



Bright O. Richards

May 11, after dinner

Bright O. Richards was a famous actor in Liberia when the war broke out. He fled to the Netherlands in 1991. As a trainer he inspires and helps young asylum seekers on their way to social participation and economic independence. Besides that, he makes theater performances. Together with musician Oleg Fateev, Bright will do a short performance in which he tells his refugee story and about his new existence in the Netherlands.



Lucas de Man “We, Pig Country”

May 12, 11.30-13.00

The solo theatre performance of Lucas de Man tells about Stijn, a 30-year old boy that returns to his native country after travelling around the world for 12 years. His parents were pig farmers, his brother took over the farm. In the performance Lucas uses the world of the farmer as a metaphor for our current changing world, and his quest for his own part in it.

Social and Green

Designing for social and sustainable innovation is a new playing field for designers. At the core of The Beach' activities in Amsterdam Nieuw-West is designing situations that allow for the shaping of new meanings and new relationships. New perspectives on social and organisational issues are urgently needed. While we explore possible figurations of the new social landscape we meet people who are committed to work together. To find answers to complex societal issues, with a focus on 'social and green city making' that very often includes food and landscape.

Green connects

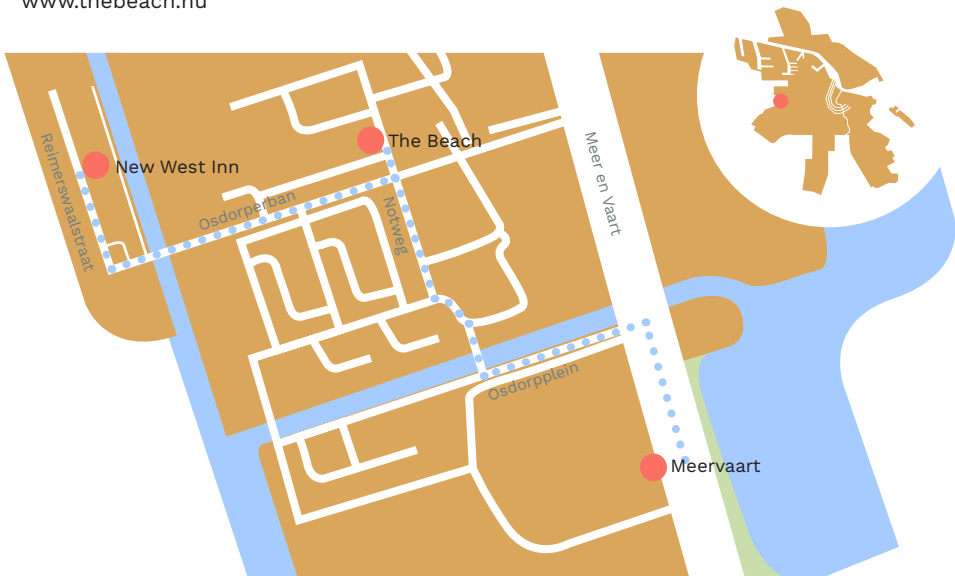
Green and open space characterises the Amsterdam Nieuw-West area. In the thirties city planner and architect Cornelis Van Eesteren's aim was to create green structures that equals the built infrastructure of roads and buildings. Van Eesteren's AUP plan (General Expansion Plan) was developed in the early twentieth century as an answer to the explosive urbanisation of the nineteenth century. According to Van Eesteren areas cannot flourish when separated. He arranged the various areas of the city in an "organic" and "functional" manner, like the various functions of the body.

A new era

Nowadays, in a new era, city making is more and more initiated by local citizens instead of institutions. At local hubs a mixture of citizens with divers cultural backgrounds and a wide community of artists, students and innovative entrepreneurs meet and co-create. Results include, amongst many others, bio based energy production using leftover bread, co-operative cafés, local craft workshops, edible gardens, mobile kitchens and various festivals around crafts, food and circular city making.

The "organic" city making continues by creating new meaning for an era that embraces values like localism, sharing, connectedness and proportionality.
