→ Common Network Statistics / CNS ←

- tool for the self-assessment of NRNs
 - regular/yearly basis
 - central data collection and analysis by the ENRD CP







Purpose of the CNS

- collecting and raising awareness about the achievements of NRNs
- benchmarking
- identification of useful NRN activities/examples across Europe
- regular and systematic tracking of the progress within a separate NRN
- new added value: helping NSUs in the monitoring process by creating links between indicative links between the CNS and the mandatory indicators reported by NRNs

- I. Events
- II. Communication tools
- III. Collection, analysis and dissemination of good practice
- IV. Thematic and analytical exchanges
- V. Cooperation and contribution to ENRD & EIP activities
- VI. Capacity building and training
- VII. Support for LEADER/CLLD TNC and inter-territorial cooperation and joint actions








I. Events

Number of events organized (by 15 NRNs)



- most of the total number of events in 2015 was reported by Latvia (654) and Poland (311)
- Around 270.000 participants in total in 2015







II. Communication tools

Publications:

- magazines, reviews, newsletters, leaflets, and epublications
- number of publications 9x higher in 2015 (716) than in 2014 (78)
- •In 2015 highest numbers of publications reported in Latvia(465), Estonia (74), Poland (72)







III. Good practices

- -good practice examples/ case studies both collected and disseminated
- the overall number increased 7x from 66 (2014) to 469 (2015)
- the higher numbers in 2015 reported in Estonia (131) and Germany (90)
- -Thematic focus mostly on LEADER/CLLD & LAGs (incl. cooperation) (P6)
- -Reported examples of specific topics: aromatic and medicinal plants, rural heritage, village recovery, young rural entrepreneur, short supply chains, map of wine regions, Returnees an issue for rural areas, female rural entrepreneurs,





Number of exchanges




*In 2015, altogether 7113 participants involved – thematic groups (1462), consultations (799), other initiatives (4867)

- •Other activities- in total 12, 1015 participants


