3rd project: Leader project to create ecovillage (2009-2013), 1 500 000 SEK



"Creation of Sweden's first permaculture ecovillage with forest garden, phase 1"

- First Submitted March 2009
- Full application August 2009
- Approved 19 Nov 2010
- Full implementation from Jan 2011
- Completed Dec 2013



The main project

"The project aim is to establish a demonstration model of international standard for high quality of life in the rural area, sustainable lifestyle and innovations for entrepreneurship."

Investment: landscaping ponds and gardens, basic infrastructure, signage.

Total budget 1 513 880 SEK

- 500 000 SEK co-finance, 90% volunteer hours
- 122 000 SEK national public co-financing

 - Unemployment Office
