to exchange on the **state of preparations for the future CAP Strategic Plans**, and specifically regarding the steps taken towards ensuring effective involvement of relevant stakeholders



to discuss different tools and approaches for ensuring the effective organisation and functioning of Monitoring Committees and for the communication of their work

- ✓ How to make **stakeholders' contributions more valuable and effective** and how MAs can help stakeholders to contribute meaningfully
- ✓ How to encourage an active involvement of all partners of the 3 main CAP/RD dimensions: agricultural, environmental, social





# **Key outcomes: Lessons Learned**

### **Monitoring Committees**

- ✓ Voting rights within the Monitoring Committee
- ✓ Online sharing of supporting documents ahead of MC meetings
- ✓ Length of formal meetings
- ✓ Informal opportunities for exchanges
- ✓ Participation of the independent evaluator in MC meetings
- ✓ Training opportunities for MC members

#### **General remarks**

- ✓ Workable balance between inclusiveness and effectiveness
- ✓ Organising the work by issue rather than by RD measure
- √ NRNs' role





# **Solution** Key outcomes: Ideas and suggestions for the future

- ✓ Review and widen the partnership, as necessary, to reflect new aspects introduced by the CSP and involve all the relevant stakeholders
- ✓ Clarify the **'rules of the game'**: participation procedures, guidelines and criteria for the selection of stakeholders
- ✓ Define the **role and functions of the MC** as soon as possible
- ✓ Be clear about **voting rights**, and as inclusive as possible
- ✓ Ensure the **involvement of non-agricultural social stakeholders**, to take into account rural development needs beyond agriculture
- ✓ Involve stakeholders engaged in the implementation of other EU funds to ensure synergy and coordination
- ✓ Use a combination of electronic platforms as well as face-to-face meetings, and smaller working groups for specific issues, to manage a high number of partners





