Objectives of the meeting

The Rural Networks' Steering Group has met twice in 2015 and has discussed and made proposals for dealing with series of priority topics emerging from the Rural Networks' (RN) Assembly. These ideas have been further refined in the two Assembly Sub groups for LEADER/CLLD and Innovation and have been translated into a set of specific activities by the ENRD Contact Point, Evaluation Helpdesk and the EIP-AGRI Service Point.

This third meeting of the Steering Group is designed to achieve the following objectives:

- To take stock of the activities of the networks up to now and to encourage active involvement in forthcoming activities;
- To debate and make proposals for ensuring RN governance structures are effective in responding to the needs of the different stakeholders involved;
- To prepare the way for the RN Assembly, including the structured involvement of RN stakeholders and the tabling of proposals for the priority activities of the RNs in 2016.
