## 1. Targeting of income support

- Improving the distribution and targeting of direct payments is a key priority of the CAP post 2020 reform
- Analysis of the current targeting to be included in the SWOT and taken into account in the needs assessment
  - Analysis of the concentration of direct payments
  - For which class(es) of farmers is the unit amount of direct payments currently reinforced?
     Does it correspond to farmers with higher needs?
  - Take into account other income support (rural development payment for areas facing natural constraints)
- Definition of possible related needs, prioritization
- > Strategy: targets and milestones, design of interventions, financial allocations



# 2. Setting and justifying unit amounts and allocations

- An iterative process
- Unit amounts
  - Based on analyses of income needs (income in EUR/worker, labour intensity, farm physical size as DP are mainly area-based, by relevant groups of farmers / territories...)
  - Targets set
  - Prioritisation of needs
  - Synergies between interventions
  - Distribution of EAGF/EAFRD financial allocations
  - Ring-fencings
- Financial allocations are indicative
  - Unit amounts
  - Planned outputs



#### 3. Consistency of interventions within SO1

- Complementarity and synergy among the interventions set out under a SO1
  - Example: fairer and more effective targeting of income support
    - Basic Income Support for Sustainability
      - Internal convergence to remove gradually the link to old historic references which cannot be justified anymore
      - Targeting towards groups of territories according to the needs
    - Complementary Redistributive Income Support to tackle the special needs of small to medium farm (physical) size
    - Round-sum for specific needs for smaller farms
    - Coupled Income Support for sectors in difficulty
    - Definitions and targeting mechanisms: capping/reduction, minimum requirements, genuine farmers...
    - Rural Development payment for areas facing natural constraints



## 4. Consistency of the strategy accross objectives

- Coherence and synergy between the interventions across all the Specific Objectives
- > DP primarily income support
- But the way DP interventions are designed can contribute to other Specific Objectives
- In case of negative trade-offs,
  - Alternative design of DP could be envisaged
  - Mitigation measures
- Overall balance
