Potential use in evaluation of the CAP

- A set of criteria for screening social innovation interventions.
- Can be used in answering the question about the impact of social innovation on a specific indicator.
- Evaluators can use it as an example of what data to collect or what types of information to seek.

Potential use in evaluation of the CAP


- A database that includes broad range of evaluation frameworks relevant for evaluating issues related to the CAP's Specific Objective 8
- An evaluation manual with specific practical guidance for evaluating social innovation
- A rapid evaluation approach based on indicators and a detailed approach based on more complex, composite indicators
- Useful for the estimation of I.01 and R.01 and can be further disaggregated by the special objective(s) in which the innovation took place

- Benchmark when designing evaluations of innovation in the context of the CAP, in particular social innovations
- Helps assess causality (i.e. whether the change resulted from the implementation of a specific social innovation project or from other aspects)
- Offers a different approach to impact assessment that would pay greater attention to 'qualitative' developments such as network building, community engagement, increased participation, etc




