




Context for Smart Villages

Rural areas are locked into a "circle of decline" by two mutually reinforcing trends—

- a shortage of jobs and sustainable business activity
- 2. Inadequate and declining services.

- and where traditional and new networks are enhanced by means of digital communications technologies, innovations and the better use of knowledge for the benefit of inhabitants".

 - Economy and quality of life (services)






Scope

The WS will explore how rural services in areas such as health, social services, education, energy, transport, retail and others, can be improved and made more sustainable through




