

Drawing on the previous ENRD thematic work on the transition to the green economy and resource efficiency, this newly launched Thematic Group on 'Mainstreaming the Bioeconomy' aims at encouraging the development of sustainable bioeconomy value chains that promote employment and economic growth in rural areas, while preserving their eco-systems.
