



Where is the value concentrated?





"To achieve a wide deployment of **sustainable biobased value chains**, it is necessary to develop business models that can be replicated and **adapted to a variety of locations and contexts**, with lower levels of investment, risk and technical sophistication, which can be plugged into established food and bio-based value chains or to stimulate new alternatives, **taking advantage of the benefits of the particular location** (resource availability, socio-economic factors, etc.).

A wider range of actors need to get involved, including farmers and forest owners (alone or in association), small businesses, etc.

By operating at local / regional level, these models will also facilitate **circular approaches** between exploitations and across sectors. To achieve these objectives, **small-to-medium scale solutions** seem to be most appropriate. **Innovative organisational models** should also be developed, to promote cooperation within and outside the primary sector. "
