 - ✓ External environment: broadband infrastructure & facilities (hubs), links to wider rural community & service environ.



Discussion: Stage 1

Stage 1: Discussion in pairs

What are the most relevant examples from your perspective?

What are the main points of interest/questions that you would like to find out about these examples? (challenges, interesting aspects, etc.)

Agree 2 examples that you'd like to see being developed into case studies

Identify a set of specific questions of particular interest





Discussion: Stage 2 (&3)

Stage 2: Discussion in group of 6 (=3 pairs)

Discuss why pairs picked the 2 examples and points of interest / questions

Narrow down from (up to) 6 to 2 examples / group

Define or refine questions and points of interest

Stage 3: Feedback from groups & voting (after lunch)
