PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT 2014-2020

- 1. Selection of policy objectives
- 2. Policy choices, coordination and complementarity
- 3. Contribution to the budgetary guarantee under InvestEU with justification
- 4. Transfer between categories of region with justification
- 5. Preliminary financial allocation by policy objective
- 6. List of programmes
- 7. A summary of actions to be taken to reinforce administrative capacity

Joint design of national documents

- Need to coordinate the design of linkages between two national strategic documents
- More stringent requirements from EU regulations
- Political will is the first necessary ingredient
- A common institutional place where the programme design stems from collaboration between different administrations and private stakeholders

Definition of rural areas with high depopulation trends and decline of services

4 types of rural areas:

a) peri-urban areas

b) Intensive and specialized agriculture

- c) Intermediate rural areas
- d) Less developed rural areas

Two types of areas:

- a) Peripheral areas;
- b) Ultra-peripheral areas

Co-ordinated design of policy objectives

- CAP specific objectives 7-8-9 are highly closed and interrelated to policy objective 5 of the Parntership Agreement
- At the same time addressing ERDF and ESF to de-populated areas needs to consider also EAFRD interventions in rural areas
- This will requires a participation of EAFRD representatives to the Partnership agreement tables

Co-ordinated design at programme level. Different and complementary options:

- Having just one LDS for high de-populated rural areas, including Leader or other EAFRD measures (highly unrealistic scenario)
- Having different streams of interventions, separately, and requiring that they coordinate their strategies if they overlap in the same territory (requirements in NSP and PA)
- Specific selection criteria rewarding projects financed under EAFRD in rural areas for smart villages strategies
