

## 'Bioeconomy and Climate Action in rural areas'

## Agenda - First TG meeting - 25 September 2019

From September 2019 on, the ENRD will animate a Thematic Group (TG) on 'Bioeconomy and Climate Action in rural areas'. The TG will explore rural activities within the bioeconomy that provide the most significant climate benefits, in particular in terms of mitigating climate change - such as reducing GHG<sup>1</sup> emissions throughout value chains, sequestering carbon through specific production practices, and providing climate neutral material and energy solutions for society.

The TG will identify opportunities to increase and valorise the delivery of climate outcomes at different stages of rural bioeconomy value chains, in particular using tools and support approaches that can be linked to the Rural Development Programmes and the future CAP Strategic Plans.

The objective of the first TG meeting is to discuss the areas of action at different aspects of rural bioeconomy – including production, processing, distribution and consumption – where it is possible to significantly contribute to climate objectives. The meeting will also discuss the support needed to promote and upscale action in the areas with most potential, in particular with the use of the Rural Development measures.
