## 'Bioeconomy and Climate Action in rural areas'

## Agenda 4th TG meeting – 28 April 2020 - webinar

Since September 2019 the Thematic Group has discussed the <u>opportunities</u> to increase rural bioeconomy's contribution to climate change mitigation, approaches to <u>promote and upscale</u> mitigation practices, and ways of <u>tracking and demonstrating</u> rural bioeconomy activities' contribution to climate change mitigation.

The fourth meeting of the Thematic Group will discuss how climate change mitigation can be made economically viable and attracting for rural actors. The meeting will explore ways to recognise and remunerate rural actors for their climate efforts, for example through public schemes such as those supported by the CAP / Rural Development Programmes.

The meeting will benefit from collaboration with the Walloon National Rural Network. Selected rural initiatives related to the bioeconomy and climate action in the region will be highlighted during the event and discussed with the participants.

The meeting is especially targeted at National Rural Networks, RDP Managing Authorities, Local Action Groups, researchers and any stakeholders involved in bioeconomy value chains or rural bioeconomy initiatives.

The meeting will be organised as a webinar. It will consist of stakeholder presentations and facilitated discussion among the participants. The meeting will be held in English.
