Awareness raising: at national, regional and local level about the use and benefits of TIA processes to increase sensitivity of policy makers at different levels towards territorial impacts

Increase capacity building: at different governance levels and sectors

Learning exchange: increase the policy learning of sector policies' officials about the effects of other sector policies and national policy impacts on specific territories

 Provide an integrated methodology: provide eventually a more efficient and more integrated methodology that could be used by different territories
