
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### **Starting point - places and people**





### Why is it important?

- Part of the vision for Europe contained in the EU 2020 Strategy.
- Obligatory and translated into operational terms through regulations (CPR)
- Clear guidelines through the Code of Conduct on Partnership
- Specific role for National Rural Networks
- Core objective of all Rural Networks





### What benefits is it expected to bring?

(Introduction to the Code of Conduct)

- Commitment and ownership
- Knowledge, expertise, viewpoints to improve design and implementation of strategies
- Improving fund management and transparency in decisions
- Reducing gaps in coordination and capacity between different levels of government

### Who are the key stakeholders

- 23% EU population = predominantly rural 115 million rural inhabitants – all types?
- 35% (177 m) intermediate. Cities dwellers?
- Stakeholder directly affected by RDPs?
- Rural stakeholders affected by Regional and Cohesion Policy broad rural development?

### Regional and Cohesion Policy in Rural Areas



- €351.8b total (excluding EAFRD)
- 20-28% in predominantly rural areas = €70.4-€98.5b
- Shape conditions for rural development:
  - Support for R+D, transport, broadband, environmental + social infrastructure...
  - SMEs, employment, social inclusion and social innovation

But what channels do rural stakeholders have for influencing these other policies and funds?





#### Possible levers in the RDPs

- RDPs often the only explicitly rural strategies at national, regional, local levels.
- Provisions for coordination between funds and pillars.
- Cross-cutting objectives, combination of measures...
- Cooperation Measure
- Multifunding + role of 2000+ Leader Groups
- Role of 80,000 rural municipalities
- Role of key rural agents Farm advisors....

Can these be catalysts in this period?





### Channels open to rural stakeholders

- Media (evidence, stories)

### What are the opportunities for stakeholder involvement now?

- RDP design is complete but can be adapted
- Monitoring Committees
- Measure and scheme design and roll-out
- Linkages between implementing bodies + beneficiaries horizontal and vertical
- Shaping local strategies and projects
