Exploring approaches to regional and local networking

## **Background**

The ENRD Contact Point is looking to explore how the NRNs approach regional and local networking to reach out to stakeholders more effectively. This workshop responds to specific requests to address this subject, with the intent of building on the previous activities on regionalised NRNs.

Some **in-depth mapping work** has been developed in six selected Member States - namely Belgium, France, Italy, Poland, Romania, Slovakia - to screen how local networking is happening in these quite different regional delivery models.

## **Objectives**

The workshop, organised with the support of the Belgian-Walloon Rural Network, aims to:

- Present the results of the analytical work on regional/local delivery with presentations from participants from selected countries and regions;
- Examine how the two-way flow of networking can be facilitated (centre-periphery and vice versa);
- o Explore the potential of local networking by promoting exchanges between the participants and to identify challenges and room for improvement.
