

Some statistics

GDP per capita



Poverty rate

(young people)

managers unemployment

The GDP/capita in rural areas is 72.9% of the EU-28 average

72.9%

The ratio is 48% in the EU-N13!

EU-28 average for rural areas

33.8% in the EU-N13!

<u>In cities</u>: 20.1% in EU-N13, 24.4% in EU-15 Young people (15-29) at risk of poverty or social exclusion (EU-28 average. 2014).

29.8%

Up by 3.9% between 2009-2014.

The average young farm manager ratio in the EU-27 (2013) was 0.11.

Farm

(younger than 35)/elderly (older than 55) *In Cyprus* (0.02) – *in Austria* (0.39)

Youth (age 15-24) unemployment in rural areas (EU-28) in 2016.

Youth

15-74 year-old population (8.3%) <10% in AT, DE, NL, >40% in EL, ES.

Trends

Rural population

Down by 1.2% (2011-2016) / Overall EU-28 increased by 1.4%

Growth driven by the EU-15, while decrease of 4% in rural areas in the EU-N13

Aging


share of working age population in rural areas decreased by 1.6% (EU-28)

Unemployment

(age group 15-74)

Decreased by 1.6% between 2014-2016 (EU-28, rural areas)

8.3% (rural areas, EU-28 / DE 3% - EL, ES ~ 20%)

Based on 18 indicators in 5 domains age group 15-29


Education

Civic participation



In summary...

- While the overall EU population increased slightly, rural population has decreased
- The share of working age population is decreasing
- There is considerable variation among MSs in youth unemployment within the EU (range between 5.3-47.4%) in rural areas
- A considerable part of migration in the EU is represented by the age group between 25-50
- Unemployment in rural areas is gradually decreasing in most of the EU
- Leaving` from rural areas can be characterised as migration to towns and suburbs or cities within the same EU MS, as well as migration to other EU MSs
