

## **ENRD Workshop on 'Combatting rural depopulation:**

Creating new opportunities for vibrant rural areas'

Rural depopulation is an increasing trend across Europe. Many rural areas are locked into a 'circle of decline' by two mutually reinforcing trends i) a **shortage of sustainable business activity**; and ii) inadequate and **declining services**. Rural Development policy can play an important role in combatting depopulation through the toolkit of measures it provides to Member States. However, this fundamental challenge requires interventions that go beyond the remit of the CAP and require more joined up work with other EU, national, regional and local policies.

## **Objectives**

In this context, the ENRD workshop on 'Combatting Rural Depopulation' seeks to achieve the following objectives:

- Enhance the understanding of the key drivers of population decline in rural areas across the EU and their effects, with a focus – among others – on the barriers faced by marginalised groups, women, people with disabilities and migrants;
- Allow participants to learn from national and local initiatives and to share lessons on how to address rural depopulation and turn it to opportunities;
- Explore the role of the RDPs and other EU policies in creating an enabling environment to counter demographic decline.
