

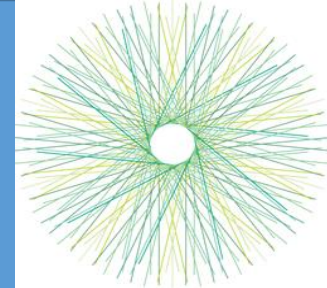

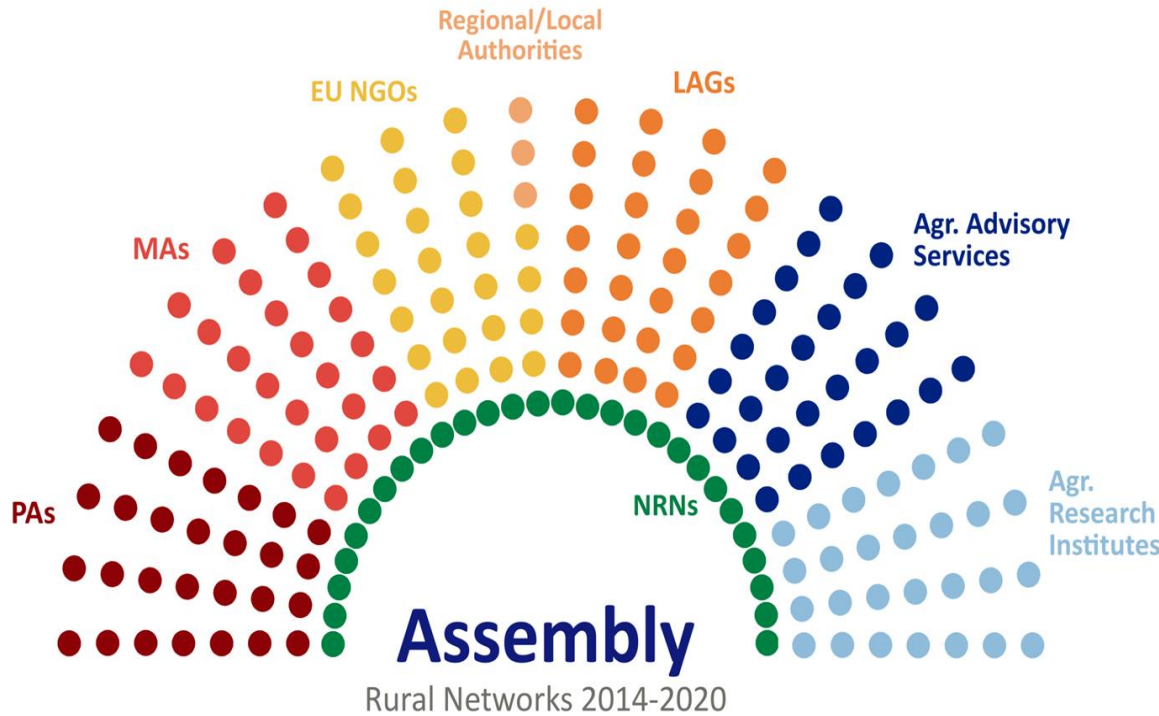

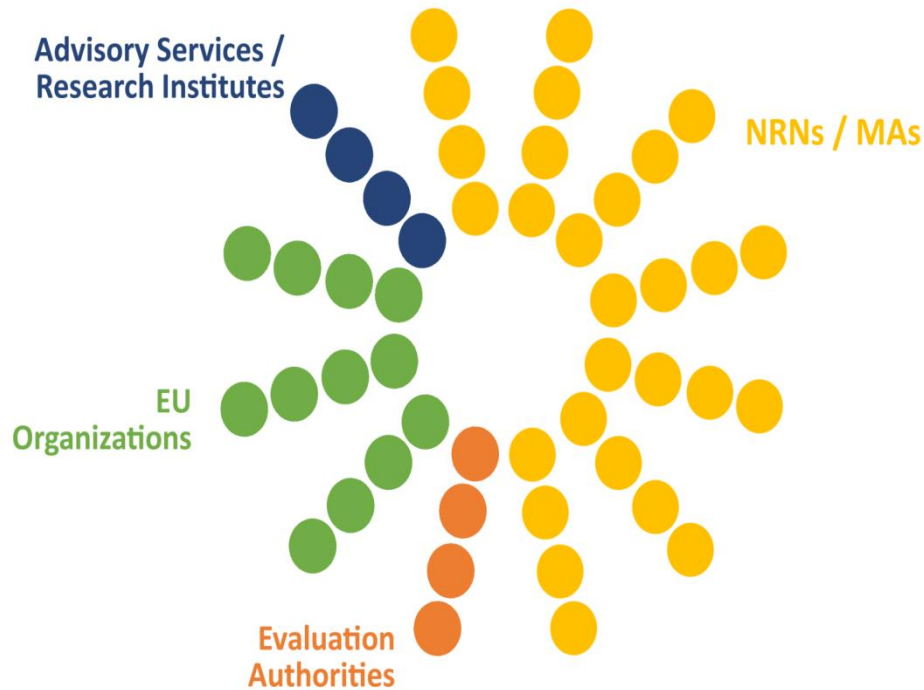

What should be assessed?

N.B.: this does not mean assessing the Network Support Units

Contact Point, Evaluation Helpdesk and Service Point are service providers in charge of animating the networks.

Even if they animate most networking activities they are not the subject of the assessment

Difference between network and NSU

Network:

web of interactions and links between different actors

Networking:

process of sharing and exchanging of information, practices, experiences, ideas and resources. Networks do not become operational without networking processes

Network Support Unit (NSU):


the structure needed for running the network to facilitate the networking process and the engagement of stakeholders

Evaluation or Self-Assessment?

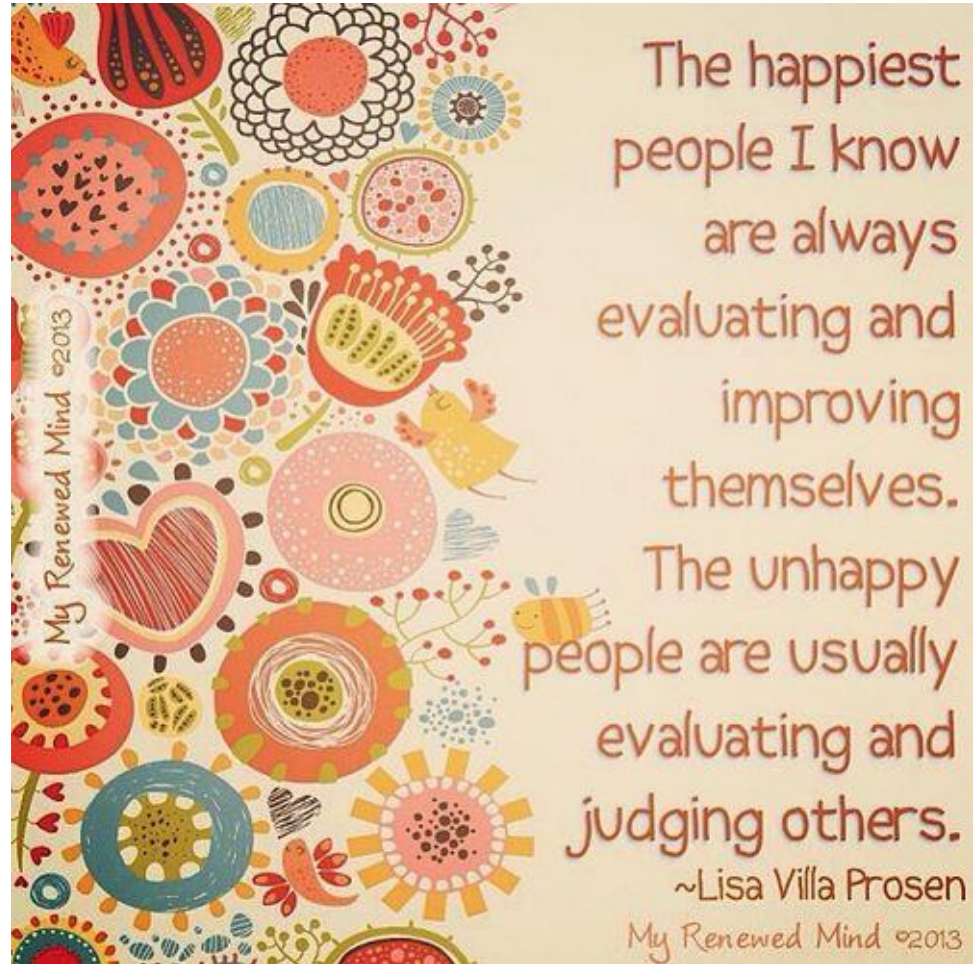
Evaluation and self-assessment serve different purposes.

As all other EU policies, Networks are subject to **external evaluation** - by independent experts selected through public calls - in order to demonstrate their contribution to the RD, CAP and wider EU objectives.

Through **self-assessment**, networks assess their own operations on an on-going basis, with the aim of drawing lessons learnt and to continuously adapt their rolling plan and improve their activities.



It is very important to distinguish formal evaluation from self-assessment



Where should we start from?

"Likewise evaluation, on-going self-assessment starts with developing an **intervention logic** for the network, with setting clear objectives and indicators, and then goes on with continuously monitoring the progress and feeding results back into the work of the network."
