The fisheries CLLD context

- +/- 300 expected FLAGs
- 20 Member States



Needs analysis indicated:

- 95% of FLAGs foresee cooperation activities within their new strategies
- 68% of the MAs, claim to have "little to no experience in cooperation"
- All 19 National Networks (NNs) expect to play a role in supporting FLAG cooperation



FSU Support to Cooperation

3 areas of work:

- ✓ Development of knowledge base
- ✓ Information dissemination & animation
- ✓ Methodological/technical support

Targeted at:

- EMFF Managing Authorities (MAs)
- National Networks (NNs)
- > FLAGs





Developing a Knowledge Base

- Collection of information on MS rules & procedures
 - > EU overview of MS rules
 - > 1 page factsheet per MS (+ certain regional specificities)
 - > Information on other relevant funds and support units

Cooperation Landscape

- Researching project examples
 - « Good Practice » project descriptions

Good Practices

- Development of a cooperation « dashboard »
 - Excel spreadsheet as a project/idea tracking tool for internal use

tracking

- Development of FAQs (on demand)
 - Written answers and clarifications on FARNET website

Information Dissemination & Animation

- Cooperation page on the FARNET website
 - Cooperation landscape (rules & procedures around Europe)
 - Notice board for cooperation proposals & link to ENRD LAG-FLAG database partner search tool
 - > tools and resources (FAQs, existing guides, MS examples...)
 - > Cooperation project examples
- Social media animation
- Direct partner matching (email, telephone, events)
- Cooperation activities at transnational FLAG seminars
- Ensuring FSU / FLAG participation in external events

Methodological/technical support

- Direct bilateral support to MAs and NNs
 - discussions about planned rules and procedures
 - > examples from other MS
 - supporting communication between MA and FLAG level

MA & NN meetings

- > clarification of EU level requirements
- > examples of projects and procedures followed
- ➤ harmonsing rules & procedures (including project calls & eligibility criteria)
- sea-basin and thematic exchange
- exchange of how MAs and NNs can support cooperation

Direct support to selected FLAG projects

- methodological guidance (telephone, email...)
- > Attendance at specific partner meetings

Lessons from the past

- * Role of networks in:
 - ✓ Giving visibility to project ideas
 - ✓ Putting FLAGs in contact
 - ✓ Centralised information point
 - ✓ Easy access to advice

- Keep things simple!
