LEADER PEER REVIEW

Evaluation and dissemination of good practices for Leader / CLLD local development

Proposal of activity:

LEADER Peer Review Leader is an evaluation and selection process of good practices for local development carried out between «PEER» (in other words LAG with the same level of experience / competence on a topic.

Target: LAG

Description:

LAGs make <u>assessments</u> on a range of concrete experiences that are demonstrating a strategic role for the sustainable, inclusive and smart development of rural territories.

Evaluations are carried out on <u>territorial case studies</u>. The case studies do not necessarily have to be LEADER. In any case they must have the following characteristics: to be geographically and thematically circumscribed; to have an integrated character (that is, to have favoured the creation of networks between local public and private actors) and multisectorial (that is, to have favoured the connection between different sectors of the local economy);to have a collective fallout (i.e. having generated benefits not only for the local population).

Working steps:

- 1. Preparatory NRNs identify case studies and prepare self-assessment / evaluation tools for LAGs;
- 2. <u>Self-assessment</u> the LAGs (or other local actors) involved in the case studies prepare a Self-Assessment Report;
- 3. <u>Visit of the Peers</u> The Peers visit the case study area, they interview different groups of stakeholders, perform an evaluation and give a first verbal feedback (video-resumed). Following the visit, the Peers elaborate a draft of the report that is commented by the contact person of the case study.
- 4. Peer Review Report Drafting of the Peer Review Final Report.
- 5. <u>Transfer</u> the results and recommendations deriving from the Peer Review are translated into concrete improvement actions.

Timing: April 2018 – December 2019







LEADER PEER REVIEW

Evaluation and dissemination of good practices for Leader / CLLD local development

Expected results:

short-term (2014-2020)

- 'certification' of LEADER good practices and / or transferable in the context of Local Development Strategies
- recovery of the capacity of LEADER / CLLD to foster innovation at local level through the implementation of quality pilot projects
- start up and implementation of innovative and quality **cooperation** projects
- dissemination and adoption of self-evaluation / evaluation practices and tools among LAGs.

medium-term (preparation of the post-2020 programming)

• identification of **new themes** for rural local development to be proposed for the next programming period

long-term (post 2020)

• **spin-off** that is the start-up of a new activity (or actor) that maintains a solid link with the promoter LAG, in terms of an approach (integrated and sustainable) and methodologies (participatory)
