

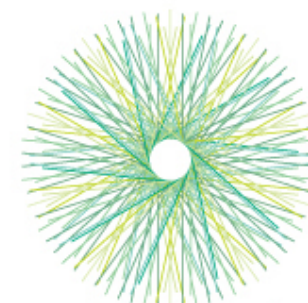

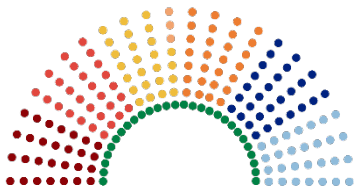

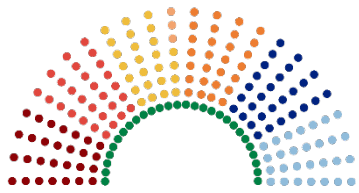

How can the networks add value?

- Understand diversity of stakeholders (esp farmers) and their motives. Listening, dialogue.
- EU level encourage sectoral interests to come together
- EU Networking to support practical simple action at national and local level.
- More attention to social inclusion migration
- Perspective of future. Rural areas as source of innovation
- Linking network tools to decision making (eg research)

WS 2 - Farmers in Innovation

What could be effective communication channels for the EU Networks to use?

- Make use of existing networks and their channels
- Traditional/new tools – for different generations
- Database of good solutions

What should be main messages to address?

- Remember to show clear benefit for farmers for being part of network
- Farmers learn from other farmers the best, practical demonstration sites - visualisation of results
- Simple language, targeted messages
- Illustrate more broader understanding of innovation (not only technology), illustrate also farmers social role
- Have a dialogue with farmers before making/improving networks – collect their needs (face to face meetings)

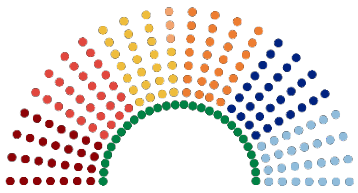

How can stakeholders in EU Networks contribute?

- We should know our farmers – age, internet skills/access
- Language – translation (develop automatic translation options?)
- Identify priorities in research agenda topics

What benefits for the farmers should the EU Networks highlight?

- Farmers need concrete responses to their problems
- Circle of involving farmers, researchers, advisors – involving farmers in scientific trials and sharing them with other farmers,
- Peers to peers communication
- Clear information needed

WS 3 & 4 - Networking priorities

Report

Priority challenges/themes:

- Management and performance – increasing effectiveness and reducing error rates
- Simplification of implementation - particularly CLLD
- Improving advice and capacity - empowering advisory services
- Addressing demographic challenges – both addressing youth and aging populations in rural areas on a whole range of issues – social, economic, environmental
- Monitoring and evaluation – multi-ESI programme funding initiatives (CLLD)
- Rural / urban dynamics and linkages
- Multi-fund approaches to address wider rural development
- Biodiversity and multi-functionality
- Linkages between Pillar 1 and Pillar 2
- Financial instruments – role in supporting rural economic development, food security and resource efficiency

Communicate the results of what has been achieved!

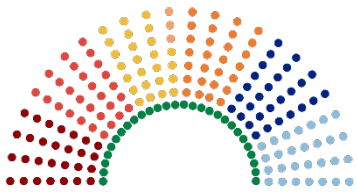
WS 3 & 4 - Networking priorities

Report



Importance/value / contribution of networking:

- Bringing people together – collaborative diversification!
- Building trust – between government /stakeholders / beneficiaries – throughout the programming period
- Improving understanding of measures, their purpose and what they can achieve → improved effectiveness of delivery
- Platform for sharing good practice (implementation and evaluation) – also learning from failure Communicating the results of what has been achieved

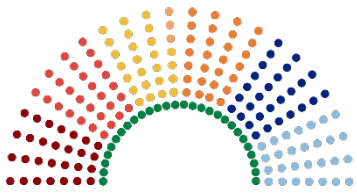

- Seminars /webinars – sharing best and bad practices
- LAGs as a communication tool
- Sustainable partnerships – more interaction between farmers and other stakeholders
- Pilot projects / connecting farmers' needs with research - eg operational groups on soil quality
- Innovation needs markets – new business models for farmers
- Optimise money for innovation by connecting H2020 and RDP innovation, and involving farmers in H2020
- Innovative farm network – farmer to farmer communication with scientific advice
- H2020 thematic network on organic arable farming

Prioritising activities

Where can EU rural networks add the most value in practice?

Main Priorities

- Easier to understand:
 - Synthesis of documents – summaries in different languages
 - Guides to policy, fund etc.
 - Short videos
- Good practice:
 - Easy to search database - by country, by theme,
 - Also practice that does not work – learning from experiences
- Support bottom-up communication flows
 - Getting info from the ground to European level and then disseminate it
 - Info from LAGs – EU organisations – other stakeholders

Prioritising activities

Where can EU rural networks add the most value in practice?

Main Priorities

- Develop forums
 - Share good practice
 - Ask questions of peers
 - Database of communications experts
- Not just making information available but really supporting its dissemination
 - Support take-up of good practice
 - More effort to disseminate outputs
 - Citizen-summary style accompanying outputs
