- Re-using and linking to existing information
- Serving diverse stakeholders at EU level

But does not aim at...

- Replacing existing national solutions
- Centralising more than necessary
- Replacing or modifying existing offline procedures and practices

General Philosophy

- **Single point for Justice e-Services**
- **Step by step approach**
- **Multilingual from day one**
- **Co-owned by the Member States**
- **Decentralised as much as possible**
- **Ambitious!**

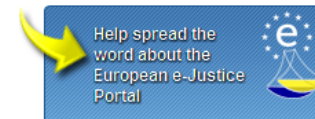

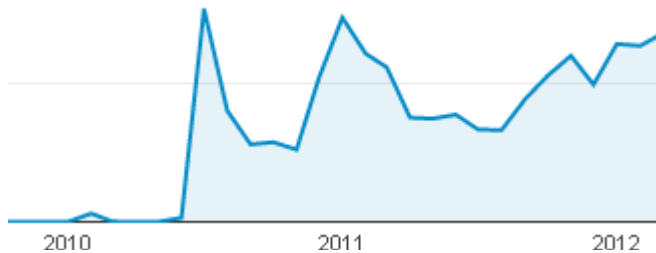

Facts and figures

- 831,343 visits and 3,471,190 page views since launch (from 196 countries)
- 458,137 visits in 2011
- Approximately 55,000 visits per month – increasing trend:



- As of April 2012 about 20,000 pages of content in 22 of the official EU languages
- More than 2,000 forms being generated from the Portal per month
