All students benefit from the teaching of a modern foreign language from the beginning of their compulsory education. Since September 2019, the teaching is compulsory from the age of 3 .

The obligation to learn a modern language applies until the end of compulsory education, e. until the age of 16 . However, modern languages are compulsory for students who continue their education beyond compulsory education to prepare for certain diplomas (general, technological and professional Baccalaureate, CAP).
