Directorate D, Government finance statistics (GFS)

Directorate D's mission is to provide the European Union with high-quality statistical information in the area of government finance statistics in order to monitor, implement and develop Union economic policies and, in particular, the statistical implications of the Stability and Growth Pact.

The particular objectives of the Directorate are:

- To continue methodological developments in public finance leading to more harmonised public finance statistics.

- Producing and disseminating high quality annual statistics on detailed revenue and expenditure of general government, detailed taxes and social contributions receipts of general government, and general government expenditure by function (Classification of the Functions of Government (COFOG), main aggregates, taxes and tax indicators, annual structure of government debt, in accordance with applicable regulations and methodology;
- Producing and disseminating high quality quarterly financial and non-financial accounts for the general government, and quarterly government debt accompanied by collections on inter-governmental lending and a compilation of lending in the context of the EFSF, in accordance with applicable regulations and methodology.
