## Farm structure in Belgium - 2005

52% of the agricultural land is in farms of 50 ha or more

This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications on the results of the Farm Structure Survey (FSS) 2005. It provides a brief but nevertheless comprehensive insight into the farm structure in Belgium. A similar publication was issued in October 2004 presenting the results of the FSS 2003 in Belgium.

\* \* \*

In May 2005 in Belgium, about **49.5 thousand\* agricultural holdings** had an economic size of at least 1 European Size Unit (ESU).


- These holdings employed 68.7 thousand AWUs (annual work units), the equivalent of 68.7 thousand persons working full time;
- they made use of about 1.4 million ha of agricultural area, which is on average **27.9** ha per holding (compared to 26.4 ha in 2003).

Among these 49.5 thousand agricultural holdings

- 27% made use of less than one AWU, while 22% made use of 2 or more AWUs:
- 24% used less than 5 ha agricultural area, while 4% used 100 ha or more;
- 17% were holdings of the type specialist cattle rearing and fattening, 14% were specialist dairy farming, 13% were general field cropping, 11% were engaged in combined field cropping and grazing livestock, and 9% were specialist horticulture;
- 20% of their agricultural area was situated in less favoured or mountain areas;
- 1% were organic farms;
- 20% benefited from direct investment aid.

#### Among the 46 thousand sole holders


- 15% were women;
- 42% were aged 55 or more, and 7% were younger than 35 years;
- 9% had another gainful activity as their major occupation.




<sup>\*</sup> Due to differences in the threshold across Member States, the total number of farms is not comparable between countries. This is why the present analysis, including Tables 1-4 and the graphs focus on holdings of at least one ESU. See methodological notes for more information on the concept of the ESU.

#### **▶METHODOLOGICAL NOTES**

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in Belgium was carried out in May 2005 on an exhaustive basis. Such full-scale agricultural censuses have been conducted on an annual basis since 1960. The reference date of the FSS 2005 was 1 May 2003, however for farm labour force and under cover cropping the reference period was the preceding 12 months.

The FSS relates to agricultural holdings whose utilised agricultural area is one hectare or more and those whose area is less than one hectare if they produce a certain proportion for sale or if their production unit exceeds certain physical thresholds. The target population was all the farms with an operating base located in Belgium.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size, is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

In this publication all data concerning the size of the holdings (in ESU) and the farm type are preliminary due to only partly updated SGM values.

Annual work unit (AWU) is equivalent to a worker employed on a full time basis for one year. In Belgium it is 1800 hours (225 working days of 8 working hours per day).

**Livestock Unit (LU)** is equivalent to a dairy cow. The number of animals (number of heads) is converted into LU using a set of coefficients reflecting the feed requirements of the different animal categories.

**Subsistence farming** refers here to all farms below 1 ESU economic size. Note that the number of farms cannot be compared between countries due to the differences in coverage of FSS.
